

## **China 2024 Asian International Stamp Exhibition Report**

All-China Philatelic Federation

China 2024 Asian International Stamp Exhibition was held from November 29 to December 3, 2024, at the Shanghai Exhibition Center. This event was hosted by the State Post Bureau of China and co-organized by Shanghai Municipal Transportation Commission, Shanghai Jing'an District People's Government, China Post Group Corporation Limited, and All-China Philatelic Federation. Themed "Stamps Present Asian Culture," the exhibition aimed to expand and develop friendly relations and close cooperation among FIAP members, promote every aspect of philately in the FIAP region, commemorate the 75th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China, and commemorate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Federation of Inter-Asian Philately.

Totally over 323 exhibits in around 1,617 frames plus 49 literature exhibits were displayed, covering 16 competitive classes: FIAP Championship, Traditional, Postal History, Postal Stationery, Aerophilately, Astrophilately, Thematic, Maximaphily, Revenue, Modern Philately, Picture Postcard, Open Philately, Youth, OFE, Literature, and Experimental Class—First Day Cover, which was introduced for the first time as a competitive class in a FIAP exhibition. Altogether, 29 FIAP members participated in the competitive exhibition, and there were 120 international and domestic sales booths. The event attracted over 100,000 visitors. The Jury consisted of 54 members, with Dr Prakob Chirakiti as Honorary President, Mr Tay Peng Hian and Mr Surajit Gongvatana as Senior Consultants, and Mm Jiao Xiaoguang as Jury President. A total of 21 Large Gold medals and 40 Gold medals were awarded.

The exhibition featured five theme days: Opening Day, Shanghai Culture Day, Youth Day, Palmares Day, and FIAP Day. China Post Group Corporation Limited issued a set of four commemorative stamps and one souvenir sheet for this event. During the exhibition, the Organizing Committee arranged a visit to the Shanghai Museum for Commissioners. A special display area showcasing the Shanghai Youth Post Office was set up at the exhibition hall. On Youth Day, a philatelic lecture for youth collectors was held, and the 4th Shanghai Letter-Writing Culture Festival was launched. The festival aimed to guide young people to showcase Shanghai's historical culture and local customs through letters and help the younger generation rediscover the charm of traditional correspondence.

PHILAKOREA 2025 World Stamp Championship Exhibition, held from 17 to 21 September at the COEX Magok Exhibition Center, concluded with great acclaim, bringing together the finest philatelic minds and collections from around the world.

Organized by the Philatelic Federation OF Korea and Korea Post, under the patronage of the Fédération Internationale de Philatélie (FIP) and Auspices of Federation of Inter-Asian Philately (FIAP).





The Election Committee consists of no more than four members with the FIAP President and FIAP Secretary General as the President and Honorary Secretary of the Election Committee respectively. This Election Committee will meet annually to consider the nominations of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists and agrees the names of the new signatories which are at its absolute discretion as sanctioned by the Congress.

A signing ceremony for the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists will take place annually preferably at the FIAP Patronage Exhibitions.

An invitation to sign the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists is regarded as the Asian's and World's pre-eminent philatelic honour.

### **The Election Committee:**

The current Election Committee was proposed and approved at the FIAP Executive Committee Meeting held in Bangkok on 30 November 2023 composed of four Asian philatelists.

## The Registrar of the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists:

The FIAP Secretariat will be the Registrar of the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists. The Registrar will

- 1 Publicise as widely as possible the time, place and procedure for the receipt of nominations on an annual basis.
- 2 Gather the nomination forms received and put forward to the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists Election Committee.
- 3 Make preparations for the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists Election Committee meeting to select the signatories.
- 4 Keep the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists.
- 5 Any other assignments as advised by the Election Committee.

### The Honorary Secretary of the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists Election Committee:

The FIAP Secretary General will be the Honorary Secretary of the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists Election Committee. After the new signatories were selected, the Election Committee Honorary Secretary will:

- Prepare the announcement of the result of the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists selected by the Election Committee and the FIAP Patronage Exhibition that will host the Signing ceremony.
- 2 Liaise with the Organising Committee of the FIAP Patronage Exhibition for the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists signing ceremony and informing the signatories about the signing ceremony.
- Prepare the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists to be signed with the name of the selected Distinguished Philatelists, the Certificate for the new signatories and the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists pin.
- 4 Arrange for the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists Luncheon or dinner as advised by the Election Committee.
- 5 Any other assignments as advised by the Election Committee.

### Rules to Govern the Election of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists:

The form for nomination for FIAP Distinguished Philatelists can be downloaded from the FIAP website (www.asiaphilately.com).

The nomination form must be duly signed by both the Nominee and the respective FIAP Member Federation's President or Past FIAP Distinguished Philatelists in support of the Nominee.

The nomination forms will be put forward to the FIAP Distinguished Philatelists Election Committee, either by FIAP Distinguished Philatelists or by FIAP Member Federations, this is a rare honour and from the many only a few will be chosen. The task of selection is not easy. The Election Committee has together an extensive knowledge of collectors and it is safe to say that all the candidates proposed will be probably known personally to at least one member of the Election Committee.

The proposal form has been designed to accommodate sufficient pertinent information and in fairness to the candidate it is important that the form is properly completed. Well prepared forms help the Election Committee, and the following is offered for guidance.

It is the responsibility of the proposer to decide what information is included on the proposal form. However, it is not acceptable for a multi-page curriculum vitae prepared by the candidate merely to be attached to the form. If a candidate is President of a National or International Society or Federation, the date of election to that office and the total years with the organisation should suffice. The years and months marking the stepping-stones to high office as for example Chairman or Vice President often add little to the qualification. Similarly, the detailed listing of Large Gold Medals gained for the same collection is often irrelevant particularly if the collection has been awarded a Grand Prix. The Election Committee does not require copies of books published by the candidate or photocopies of articles written for philatelic journals.

The importance or otherwise of the above should be assessed by the proposer when completing the form. There should be no supplementary documents and only a single extra sheet of information will be accepted. The candidate should stand or fall by the qualifications presented by his proposer and not by the size of a dossier.

Election is by qualification and not by ballot. Informal contact in support of the candidate directed to FIAP Distinguished Philatelist Signatories, Members of the Election Committee may well be regarded as 'lobbying' or 'canvassing' and is likely be counterproductive. A candidate should remain silent, and only the original nominator or other qualified nominator, or nominating body should add updates.

All correspondence on behalf of the candidate should be addressed to the FIAP Secretariat.

#### **Nomination of Candidates:**

Nominations must be made on the special form downloaded from the FIAP website. Once nominated, a Candidate will remain on the list for four years, during which time their nomination will be considered at the annual meetings of the Election Committee. After four years, nominations will lapse but may be renewed for one further period of four years by the submission of an updated nomination form. The form will be sent to the FIAP Secretariat to forward to the Election Committee.

Organisations / Persons who may submit nominations: Nominations may be submitted by:-The FIAP Member Federations. Signatories of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists.

#### **Criteria for Nominees:**

The Nominee:

Must be a philatelist residing in the FIAP regions and belong to one of the FIAP Member Federations.

Must be distinguished by having contributed outstanding service to philately, as stipulated below under The Services.

#### The Services:

These and other relevant outstanding service to philately will be considered by the Election Committee in making their decision:

Organisational work, at a FIAP level, FIP level, Regional level, National level in connection with philatelic exhibitions, congresses or societies.

- 2 The formation of notable collections which have been exhibited or displayed for the benefit of philately.
- 3 Philatelic research or other significant works made available to others, including publications and journalistic activities.
- 4 Jury Services including at FIAP Patronage Exhibition, FIP Patronage Exhibition, etc.
- Others Information such as Promotional work, including the giving of displays, seminars, and presentations, Internationally recognized high honours, etc.

### **Nominations:**

Those nominating should note that an invitation to sign the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists is a singular honour and, for nominations to be successful, candidates need to be of commensurate distinction.

Information should be provided on the special form downloaded from the FIAP website. This is intended to assist those nominating in identifying some of the criteria that will be fully considered by the Election Committee. All nominations must have the prior consent of the nominee and certify that the information submitted is true and correct.

The closing date for the receipt of nomination forms by the FIAP Secretariat is 30<sup>th</sup> September. Forms received after this date will be held on file and dealt with as part of the intake for the year after that.

No correspondence or discussion will be entered into concerning any proceedings of the Election Committee.

Please be aware that successful candidates and their nominators will be expected to attend the signing ceremony at their own expense.

### **Honorary FIAP Distinguished Philatelist:**

There will be the Election of Honorary FIAP Distinguished Philatelists, the candidate for Honorary FIAP Distinguished Philatelists will be proposed and considered by the Election Committee. The candidate for Honorary FIAP Distinguished Philatelists will be dignitaries normally outside ranks of organized philately, in recognition of their significant support to philately.

The results of the Elected Honorary FIAP Distinguished Philatelists (if any) and FIAP Distinguished Philatelists will be announced by the end of 31<sup>st</sup> December and the signing of the Book of FIAP Distinguished Philatelists will be held at the FIAP Patronage Exhibition.

Mr Tay Peng Hian is a name synonymous with philately in Asia and beyond. His dedication, expertise, and leadership have made an indelible mark on the hobby. As the Past President of the Federation of Inter-Asian Philately (FIAP), Honorary Member and Honorary President of the Federation Internationale de Philatelie (FIP), Mr Tay's contributions are a testament to his passion and commitment.

A renowned philatelist, Mr Tay has built an impressive collection of Asian stamps and postal history of Straits Settlements, Burma and Netherlands East Indies, showcasing his expertise and research. His exhibits have garnered international acclaim, earning numerous awards and recognition. He was awarded the first FIAP Grand Prix International Award at the first FIAP Asian International Stamp Exhibition, held in Bangalore, India in 1977, for his fabulous collection of the Straits Settlements Classic.

Mr Tay also won the FIP Grand Prix International Awards thrice, for each of his three collections, Straits Settlements (PHILAKOREA 1984), Burma (POLSKA 1993) and Netherlands East Indies (PHILAKOREA 2002). His Netherlands East Indies exhibit was entered into three FIP World Stamp Exhibitions, and won three FIP Large Gold medals (with special prizes) at ISTANBUL 1996 (Turkey), STAMP SHOW 2000 (London) and PHILAKOREA 2002 (Seoul). This collection won the FIP Grand Prix D'Honneur (FIP Champion of Champions) at CHINA 2009, held in Luoyang, China. It is recognized as the best ever assembled collection of the first two issues (1864, 1866) of the Netherlands East Indies.

Mr Tay was a President of FIAP (Federation of Inter-Asian Philately), a post which he held from 1987 to 2001. He was bestowed the title of Ahli Mangku Negara (Kehormat) (AMN Honorary) in recognition of his service to philately by the King of Malaysia in 1993. He is the first foreigner to be honoured for philately. In 1996, he was invited to sign the Roll of Distinguished Philatelist (RDP) and made an Honorary Member of FIAP at the 13th FIAP Congress in 2001, Tokyo. He was elected as the FIP (Federation Internationale de Philatelie) President at the 71st FIP Congress held in Lisbon, Portugal on October 10, 2010.



## SG60 Stamp Exhibition 2025

**Association of Singapore Philatelists** 

In celebration of Singapore's 60<sup>th</sup> year of independence, the SG60 Stamp Exhibition 2025 was held from 10 to 12 October 2025 at the Visual Arts Centre, located above Dhoby Ghaut MRT.

This special three-day exhibition showcased Singapore's heritage, history, and resilience through the lens of stamps, postcards, and postal memorabilia — miniature storytellers that trace our nation's journey across time. Organised by the Association of Singapore Philatelists (ASP) with the support of three local stamp societies — the Singapore Philatelic Society, Singapore Stamp Club, and Zui You Philatelic Society — the non-competitive exhibition invited visitors of all ages to rediscover Singapore's evolving identity and aspirations through philately.

A total of 62 frames were displayed, featuring stamps, postal history, and vintage postcards contributed by 19 exhibitors across 24 exhibits. Notably, the youngest exhibitor (aged 35) and the oldest (aged 94) both presented exhibits on Singapore's National Day, reflecting how philately bridges generations.

The exhibits covered diverse themes such as Singapore's nation-building journey, the Malayan Postal Union (1949–1967), airletters, and the evolution of mail delivery. Other highlights included vintage postcards depicting Singapore in the Sixties, stories of the Sin Chew Jit Poh newspaper (predecessor of Lianhe Zaobao), Singapore Airlines, the nation's greening journey, and tributes to nursing as a noble profession.

The Official Opening Ceremony, attended by nearly 50 guests in the evening, was graced by Mr Koh Seow Chuan (Founding President, ASP) as Guest of Honour, Mr Tay Peng Hian (Honorary President, ASP), and Mr Richard Tan (President, ASP).

## MY REFLECTIONS AND COMMENTS ON SERVING AS A JURY MEMBER AT THAILAND 2025

I have been asked to share my reflections and comments on serving as a jury member at Thailand 2025.

First I express my appreciation and gratitude for being invited to serve on the jury at this well organised exhibition. I had attended the exhibition at Bangkok in 2023 when I attended the worthwhile FIAP Jury Academy that was well conducted by Mr Koichi Sato and Dr Andrew Cheung. Accordingly I was familiar with the surroundings.

The exhibits and dealer stands were placed on the lower floor of the Grand Postal Building, Bangkok. The lighting was mainly adequate although some exhibits could have been under better lighting. However I would much prefer exhibits to be shown under these conditions as opposed to some exhibitions I have attended where sunlight was able to pour in through the windows allowing sun to shine directly onto covers and stamps. At some exhibitions organisers take the precaution of throwing sheets temporarily over the exhibits until the sun shining on them moves on.

Although I am a relative newcomer to judging at FIAP I have been a national judge for over 20 years so am able to make comparisons. What I can say about this exhibition is that the judging leadership went to much effort to make all of us feel welcome and to be able to get into our work feeling very much at ease. There was plenty of humor displayed whilst we went about the serious work of trying our best for all those exhibitors who had often put in much money to show the best material available and a huge effort into preparing their exhibits. Judging is not just assessing how good an exhibit is but carefully comparing it to other exhibits to bring about an overall evenness and fairness. Much of the credit for ensuring that such fairness occurred must go to the team leaders who had the big picture in mind.

While rarity or difficulty of acquisition is always a major factor especially at the highest medal levels, treatment is very important for all exhibits especially for those that do not contain the great rarities. Good treatment enables all exhibitors to get better medals than possibly their material deserves.

The main message I would like to give to exhibitors is to improve their treatment by working on their Title Page to ensure that their title accurately reflects what their exhibit is about. Their title page should clearly include the scope of what they are going to show us. They must have a clear plan of how they are going to tell the story that they want told and that their plan should link to page numbers so we can easily find what they are outlining. A long list of rarities outlined on the opening page is not necessary if there is a good key telling us how to recognise the rarities or the exhibitor's own research as they emerge throughout the exhibit. I always say to exhibitors help us to help you.

Finally again I express my appreciation to Thailand 2025 for allowing me to participate with many fine philatelists at an event that I found very enjoyable and of course a big thank you to the exhibitors.

### **ROCUPEX 2025 – TAICHUNG & THAILAND STAMP EXHIBITION**

To enhance the philatelic friendship and mutual exchanges between Chinese Taipei and Thailand, during the 27th Asian International Stamp Exhibition in November 2011, both sides reached a consensus to co-host national-level joint stamp exhibitions in turn each year. The first Joint Stamp Exhibition was held in Bangkok, Thailand in March 2013, and in October 2014 it returned to Fengyuan, Taichung, in conjunction with Chinese Taipei's National Stamp Exhibition. The event was suspended in 2015 due to certain circumstances, but resumed in March 2016 in Chiang Mai, northern Thailand. In 2017, Fengyuan, Taichung hosted the exhibition again, and in 2018 it returned to Thailand, being held from March 23 to 25 in Bangkok at the historic former General Post Office building, which has over 80 years of history. The sixth Joint Stamp Exhibition took place in 2019 at the Postal Museum in Taipei. Thereafter, the outbreak of the global COVID-19 pandemic caused a five-year suspension of the event starting in 2020. With the easing of the pandemic in 2025, the Joint Stamp Exhibition was once again held in Taichung. This steadfast commitment symbolizes the profound philatelic bonds and enduring friendship between the philatelic communities of Chinese Taipei and Thailand.

The "ROCUPEX 2025 Taichung & Thailand Stamp Exhibition" was held from June 26 to 30, 2025, at the Yatang Hall of the Ministry of Culture's Cultural Heritage Park in Taichung City. This event marked the seventh time that both sides have cohosted the National Stamp Exhibition and the Thailand—Chinese Taipei Joint Stamp Exhibition. Thailand sent two commissioners (Mr. Metin Leeyakasa and Mr. Phongstorn Phowborom), while Chinese Taipei appointed eight commissioners. In the competitive class, a total of 256 frames of exhibits were presented, including 11 youth exhibits comprising 38 frames. Chinese Taipei contributed 34 exhibits with 165 frames, while Thailand presented 20 exhibits with 91 frames. Together with display pages and invited exhibits, the exhibition featured a total of 295 frames. This was a small-scale yet high-quality philatelic exhibition, reflecting the strong philatelic standards of both countries.

June 26 marked the opening day, featuring a grand opening ceremony and the launch event for the "Recreational Activities Stamps (Series III)." Speeches were delivered by Mr. Chiang, General Manager of Chunghwa Post (Fig. 1), Mr. Chen Yu-An, Vice President of the Federation of Inter-Asian Philately (FIAP), and Mr. Prakit Foongvanich (Fig. 2), Vice President of the Philatelic Association of Thailand. The ceremony concluded with a ribbon-cutting jointly conducted by distinguished guests from both sides.

The exhibition lasted for five days, with each day highlighting a different theme: June 26 – Culture Day, June 27 – Taichung Day, June 28 – Thailand Day, June 29 – Philately Day, and June 30 – Creativity Day. In addition to setting up a temporary post office sales area for philatelic products in the activity zone, the Taichung Post Office also provided a temporary cancellation and mail acceptance counter, a postage label printing area, and a philatelic marketplace. Chunghwa Post issued a commemorative postmark, and the temporary post office featured a different special cancellation each day based on the daily theme. Each day also saw the release of various commemorative covers, including those issued by Chunghwa Post headquarters, Taichung Post Office, guided-tour covers, and lecture covers. As in past practice, the Philatelic Association of Thailand also produced a special commemorative cancellation exclusively for the exhibition, available for visitors at the venue as a philatelic keepsake.



## **ROCUPEX 2025 – TAICHUNG & THAILAND STAMP EXHIBITION**

The organizers thoughtfully arranged daily scheduled expertguided tours of the exhibits. In the afternoon of June 28, two special lectures were held:

"Inauguration of Our National Leaders and Related Philatelic Materials" by Mr. Hui-Ching Ho

"Collecting Covers, Preserving History" by Dr. Wen-Shiang Chen (Fig. 3 - left)

On June 29, Mr. Yu-Huang Peng presented the 3<sup>rd</sup> philatelic lecture: "An Introduction to Taiwan's Commissioned Postal Agencies." The organizers also arranged a one-day sightseeing tour of Taichung City for international guests, commissioners, and jurors participating in the exhibition.

The Jury President for this exhibition was Mr. Chen Yu-An. The Philatelic Association of Thailand appointed three international jurors: Mr. Prakit Foongvanich, Mr. Jenwit Apichainunt, and Mr. Phairot Jiraprasertkun. Chinese Taipei also appointed five national jurors with national or international jury qualifications: Mr. Shih-Cheng Hsiao (who also served as Executive Secretary), Mr. Cheng-Hui Huang, Mr. Ho-Sen Chen, Mr. Wen-Long Tsai, and Mr. Yi-Fu Chen. In addition, Mr. Kun-Ming Hou was recommended as an apprentice juror for this exhibition (Fig. 4 - right).



On the morning of Saturday, June 28, the preliminary judging was completed. Jury President Chen Yu-An, besides evaluating the apprentice juror, convened the entire jury panel to conduct a frame-by-frame review of the exhibits in sequential order. This included exchanging views and experiences, consolidating overall scoring, recommending candidates for the Grand Prix National and the Grand Prix International Awards, and allocating special prizes. Preparations were also made for the exhibitor—jury feedback session scheduled on June 30. In the afternoon, the jury completed the signing of the jury report and the preparation of the awards list, thereby concluding the judging process.



On June 29, the Palmares dinner was held in the International Hall on the second floor of the National Hotel, Taichung. Members of the philatelic societies of both countries, international friends, exhibitors, and their families gathered together, with about 300 guests in attendance. The evening proceeded with the presentation of competitive class awards in order. The Grand Prix National (GPN) was awarded to the exhibit "Nicaraguan Railway Ticket-based Provisional Stamps and Uses" by Mr. Chang Chih-Ming (Fig. 5 - left). The Grand Prix International (GPI) was awarded to the exhibit "DAI NIPPON Airmail Services from Thailand (1940–1945)" by Mr. Charnchai Karnasuta.

### **ROYALPEX 2025**

Organised by the Royal Philatelic Society of New Zealand, this was a New Zealand National exhibition held 7-9 March in Palmerston North. The exhibition was opened by the Mayor of Palmerston North City, Grant Smith.

The 87 exhibitors provided 512 frames including 113 from Australia and 35 from the United Kingdom. The exhibition included the "Royal Challenge" with teams of four entries (2 x 5 and 2 x 8 frames) from Royal Philatelic Societies of New Zealand, Sydney, Victoria and London. The Challenge was won by RPSL with 353 points - one more than Victoria.

The standard of entries was generally high with 13 Large Gold and 34 Gold multi-frame exhibits. The Jury included 10 judges from New Zealand and 2 from Australia plus 4 apprentices. The Grand Award went to Jian Zhang for "Peoples Republic of China 'W' Series Issues 1967-1970".

A new award - RPSNZ "Gerald Ellott Award" for an exhibit to encourage people into philately - won by Lindsay Chitty for his Open exhibit "Maoritanga of New Zealand - the Culture of a Proud Race".

The venue was the Barber Hall and interconnected Bell Hall - good lighting and plenty of space for frames and dealers' tables. Thanks go to the Organising Committee and also to members of the Manawatu Philatelic Society (Palmerston North) for help with the venue arrangements, putting up frames and mounting/dismounting exhibits.

The Palmares was held in the official hotel just a short walk from the exhibition.

### **SYDNEY STAMP AND COIN EXPO 2025**

Sydney Stamp and Coin Expo 2025 was an Australian National Philatelic Exhibition held 20-23 March 2025 at the Wentworth Park Sporting Complex, Glebe, Sydney. It was organised by the Philatelic Association of New South Wales under the auspices of the Australian Philatelic Federation. It included 101 competitive entries from Australia, New Zealand, United Arab Emirates and India.

The Best in Show award was won by Geoff Lewis's exhibit *Mail routes in the Atlantic, Pacific and Indian Oceans, plus the routes between the oceans.* The other nominations for the award being Tom Gosse and *The King George VI Large Key Type Revenue and Postage High Value Stamps 1937-1953 used for Postage* and Bruce Chadderton's *Descent Into the Abyss*.

The Australasian Challenge, a competition between teams from each of the Australian states, the Australian Capital Territory and New Zealand, was won by New South Wales with Victoria the runner-up. A prize for the best exhibit in the Challenge went to Wayne Donaldson's Sweden & Great Britain: Mail Connections 1581 – 1880.

The Jury was chaired by Geoff Kellow and comprised 16 members plus three apprentices, and included members from New Zealand and United Arab Emirates members of the Jury

The exhibition was well intended and included over 30 dealers from Australia, New Zealand, UK, and the USA as well as Australia Post. Four society's held meetings at the Exhibition: Australian Airmail Society, Postal Stationery Society of Australia, Philatelic Society of New South Wales and Australian Postcard Society.

### THE KOREA PHILATELISTS ASSOCIATION (KPHA)

The Korea Philatelists Association (KPHA) was established as a non-profit social organization, which represents the philatelists of the DPRK as well as overseas Koreans and foreigners collecting Korean stamps. Its predecessor is the Philatelists Union of the DPRK, which was organized on December 19, 1963. The union was renamed the KPHA on March 15, 2023. It arranges exchanges among philatelists, disseminates stamp-related knowledge in society and organizes forums, workshops and experience-swapping meetings on collecting Korean stamps. It also helps philatelists to present stamps they have collected at international and national stamp exhibitions, and promotes friendly exchanges with philatelic organizations in other countries and regions. It admits overseas Koreans and foreigners as its members and actively assists their collecting of Korean stamps. It joined the FIP on June 15, 1965 and the FIAP on March 8, 2010.

### Procedure for joining KPHA

- \*Persons wishing to join the KPHA shall submit a written application for admission, and admission shall be decided by the Executive Committee of the KPHA after deliberating the application.
- If he/she joins the KPHA, he/she shall pay an admission fee of 5 US\$.
- \*Members shall pay a membership fee.
- -The membership fee shall be 10 US\$ for a year.
- -The membership fee shall be paid at any time of the year he/she likes, and the payment receipt shall be issued by the Executive Committee of the KPHA.
- -The membership fee shall be paid directly or through a bank, and in case payment is impossible for unavoidable reasons, the failure of it shall be notified to the Executive Committee of the KPHA.
- -When members fail to pay the membership fee for more than 24 months, they shall automatically be removed from the membership list.

### Preferential treatment to be received when joining the KPHA

- Members can visit the DPRK in accordance with their intention and agreement of the KPHA.
- Members shall be given priority in receiving such philately-related printed matters as stamp album and new catalogue issued by the State Stamp Bureau of the DPRK.
- Members can buy new Korean stamps at discount prices.
- Members, who are to participate in the stamp exhibitions held in the DPRK, shall be provided with counters.
- Members, who are visiting the DPRK, shall be provided with various preferential treatments at the Korea Stamp Museum and Korea Stamp Exhibition Hall.

### JENNY BANFIELD MNZM



Jenny Banfield celebrated her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday this year and in the June King's Birthday Honours List was made a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit – MNZM - for services to Philately. The medal was presented to Jenny by the Governor General at an Investiture Ceremony on 4 September 2024.

Jenny entered the philatelic world at age 65 and in 2004 became President of the New Zealand Philatelic Federation. She became a trustee and convenor of the New Zealand National Philatelic Trust 2004-2018. Became a National Judge in 2007, judging in New Zealand (at 16 exhibitions), in Australia, U.A.E and Qatar. She has exhibited internationally in six different classes — awarded one Large Gold, eight Gold and five Large Vermeil.

As Commissioner, Jenny represented New Zealand at ten FIP or FIAP exhibitions 2008-2022. Jenny represented New Zealand on the FIP Maximaphily Commission – Secretary 2012-2016, Chairman 2016-2022 – the first New Zealander to head a FIP Commission. She simplified the Maximaphily SREV and Guidelines making it easier for exhibitors and judges from all countries to understand. Received the FIP Medal of Appreciation for Maximaphily in 2023. Introduced a simplified Bin Room Procedure at MACAO 2018 – since adopted worldwide. New Zealand Delegate to the FIP Revenue Commission.

NZPF added the following important contributions Jenny has made to philately:

- \*Has prompted more nominations for various NZPF awards and established its Medal of Philatelic Excellence (equivalent to a national RDP)
- \*Travelled widely around New Zealand giving talks and seminars and generally encouraging people to become involved in exhibiting
- \*Promoted exhibiting internationally in the Open and Picture Postcard classes
- \*The Revenue class has been changed forever with her exhibit on the social effects of taxes.

Before philately, Jenny was involved in Gymnastics as Club President, Head Coach, and as a national Judge. She also received a Civic Award for work in the community.
